

# Musicians unite for fundraiser

Concert to benefit Friends of Shorefront Park in Patchogue Village

Maria Hendrickson, recreation director for the village of Patchogue, has a vision for Shorefront Park, the continuous 7-acre stretch of parkland on the Great South Bay that has been in existence since it was lined with waterfront hotels in the 1800s. Today, it is still a vibrant and busy park that includes the Patchogue Beach and Sailing Club, four busy ballfields, the new village band shell, a walking path, basketball courts and a playground for young children. Recognizing the importance of the park to the community, Hendrickson brought a proposal to the mayor and board of trustees to create the Friends of Shorefront Park to centralize the various volunteer groups working to improve the

parkland and its usefulness to village residents. One of the first projects for the friends has been to develop an accessible playground that will allow children with disabilities to play side by side with their able bodied peers, creating a truly integrated environment where compassion and acceptance can flourish.

While booking the bands for the 2008 summer concert series at Shorefront Park, Hendrickson met Jay Scott, a lifelong Patchogue resident who lives a short distance from the park and often brings his 16-month-old son there to play. Jay Scott and Grand Case Scenario headlined the only original music concert of the 2008 summer concert series and he told Hendrickson

that if he could help with the friends of Shorefront Park she should let him know. Just before Labor Day she took him up on his offer and asked if he would headline a benefit concert at BrickHouse Brewery & Restaurant. Scott did more than that, gathering a group of fellow musicians from Patchogue to share the bill with him and offering to provide his sound equipment for the day.

Scott, a 1996 graduate of Patchogue-Medford High School, has been a part of the local music scene for several years; first as part of the bands Square One and

### Leonard Leshinger

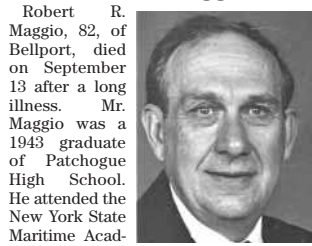

*Simple Citizen* and for the past several years as a solo artist, performing with his band *Grand Case Scenario*, all of whom are from the Patchogue area, or as an acoustic performer, sometimes alone and sometimes with other acoustic musicians accompanying him. His musical style has been described as "uniquely American music" because it blends rock, blues, folk, country, and jazz with his unique, slightly gravelly tenor voice that has been compared to Joe Cocker, Bob Seger and Bruce Springsteen. His musical career took a big step forward in 2008 with major live performances from Manhattan to Riverhead in support of his first solo album *Homegrown*, recorded live at the Patchogue Theatre for the Performing Arts in January and released in June on Paradi-dle Records.

The three performances prior to *Jay Scott and Grand Case Scenario* at the Sept. 21 fundraiser will feature Patchogue musicians Scott has worked with or admired. Multi-instrumentalist singer-songwriter Dave March was a part of *Grand Case Scenario* for a while and is also part of the increasingly popular bands *Miles to Dayton* and *The Ed Travers Band*. March will perform a rare acoustic set featuring new songs, *Miles to Dayton* classics and some of his

favorite covers.

Also appearing is 21-year-old Johnnie Lee Jordan, who burst on the local scene with an electrifying Live in The Lobby performance at the First Patchogue Folk Festival in 2006 at the Patchogue Theatre. Drawing comparisons to Bob Dylan and Tom Waits, Jordan has also been praised for "his literary style of songwriting" by *Newsday*.

Finally, music veteran John Brzozza and his band team up with 22-year old newcomer Jordan Hope to share the stage. The two worked together recently on Hope's self-produced first album, *Love*, which has caught the attention of music fans and musicians alike with her smooth voice, catchy lyrics and rhythmic guitar riffs. Brzozza has been well respected for almost 20 years on the local music scene; a gifted guitarist, vocalist and songwriter known from groups such as *The Love Junkies*, *Crayon Harmony*, *Folk Fiction*, *Shredds*, *Europa* and *The John Brzozza Band*. He hosted the open mic night at Bellport Chowder house for almost 18 years, and does the same at BrickHouse on Tuesday evenings.

The benefit concert will take place from 2-6 p.m. Tickets are \$20 which includes music, food and beer. There will be raffles, an auction for New York Jets memorabilia and a 50/50 raffle. All proceeds will benefit the Friends of Shorefront Park Playground Project. ■
